


Beth has a deep passion and devotion for church choir and orchestra music and is grateful to be a part of the HBBC music ministry. At the time of this endowment, Beth serves as Chancel Choir President and as a member of the Music Minister Search Committee.



We welcome Raleigh native, Pepper Choplin as our new Interim Minister of Music and Worship.

Pepper served Greystone Baptist Church in Raleigh until 2013 when he became a full-time composer. Recently, he served as interim at Saint Andrews Presbyterian Church in Raleigh for almost two years.

Pepper has 350 anthems and 24 cantatas in print in addition to "Come to the Water" which is in our hymnal. Many of you have attended one of his Together We Sing choral concerts at Meymandi Auditorium, where he conducts a mass choir of singers from many area churches. He is also the conductor of Cary Community Choir which sings Messiah each December. On May 28, he will be at Carnegie Hall to conduct his cantata, Our Father, in his eleventh New York concert.



Pepper has helped lead worship at Hayes Barton Baptist many times through the years. We are happy to have him with us in this new capacity.

## A note from Pepper Choplin about today's commissioned anthem:

What an honor and pleasure it is to write an anthem to celebrate the ministry of Larry Dickens! I first met Larry years ago when he was serving a church in South Carolina. Our paths have crossed in several ways throughout our ministries. I appreciate Larry as a friend and as a friend of my music. He has invited me to lead conferences and brought singers to one of my first Carnegie Hall performances.

A couple of months ago, a tune popped into my head. I had been wanting to do an anthem based on a classic hymn, and when I played the tune, the words of "O God Our Help" seemed to fall naturally into place. After setting the idea aside, Dr. Hailey called and inquired about a commissioned anthem for Larry. Knowing Hayes Barton and your love of classic hymns, I suggested the idea that had presented itself days before. After a little checking, he enthusiastically gave me the go-ahead. Later, we discovered that the hymn was one of Larry's top favorites.

I hope you will join the choir on the last verse as we celebrate Larry's ministry. Through the hymn, we give thanks to God who has helped us in the past and will give us hope for years to come.

#### ORCHESTRA ENDOWMENT PROGRAM

The HBBC Orchestra was organized in 2016. This orchestra is anchored and led by professional principal players and advanced level musicians. These talented players enable our orchestra to play at a proficiency level rarely found in the local church. Our goal is to develop the premiere church orchestra in our state. The endowed chair program, common among professional symphonies, is unique for congregational settings. This program propels the success and expands the growth of the orchestra. The Investment Committee of our church invests and directs all funds designated for this purpose.
