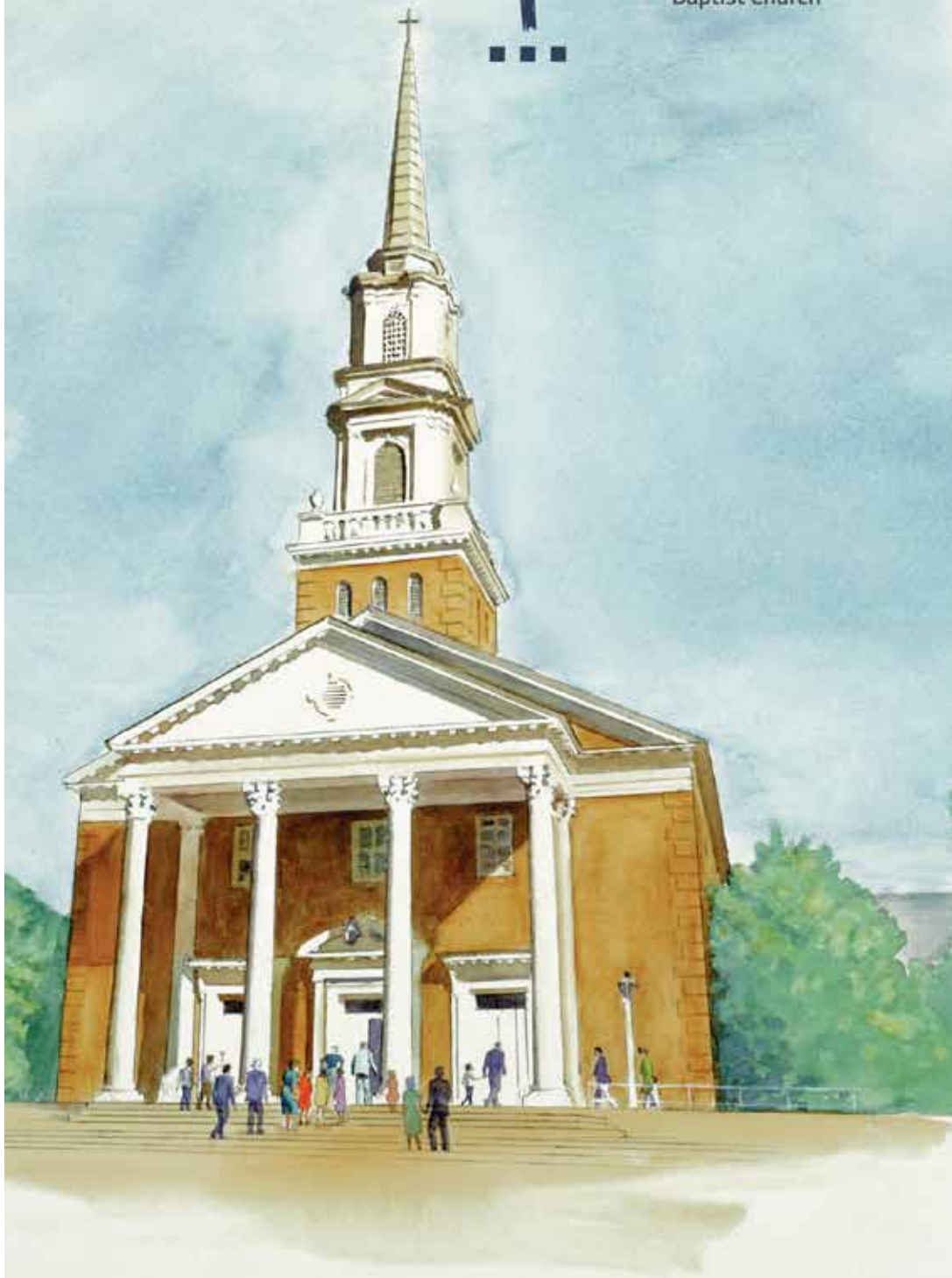

ASH WEDNESDAY - DRAWING FAITH INTO OUR DAILY LIVES

March 1st is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent, during which we symbolically prepare for the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Christians traditionally observe Ash Wednesday by wearing an ashen cross on their foreheads or right hands, symbolizing our need for God's grace. Not only does the cross inform others that we place our faith in Christ; it also invites conversations of faith into our daily routines. DEBT RETIREMENT

This month, we are asking you to consider giving to our ongoing Debt Retirement efforts. This debt was created when we built the Family Life Center (with the Turner Gym, Ledford Welcome Center, portico and connecting corridor) and the Cashwell Handicap Corridor into the sanctuary, and also includes mortgages on our properties on White Oak Road. The original debt was \$3,746,344. All monies collected will reduce the principal, thereby saving our church interest expenses. Remember: no gift too small, no gift too large, everyone participate!
