## ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICES

March 6 is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent, a time when we reflect upon Jesus' sacrifice. On Ash Wednesday, Christians around the world receive the mark of an ashen cross upon their heads to represent their penitence. On March 6 you are invited to come to one of three special services, which will take place at 8:00 AM, 12:00 PM and 5:00 PM in the Chapel. Each service will only last about 20 minutes. We encourage you to invite a friend to join you for this special service.

## ASH WEDNESDAY TAKE HOME KITS

We know it is difficult for many to come during one of our Ash Wednesday services, but know that the beginning of Lent is important in the life of our entire congregation. We encourage those that can't attend a service at HBCC to pick up an Ash Wednesday kit to help them create an Ash Wednesday service at home. These kits are designed primarily for families with children or youth and can be picked up in the Welcome Center or Nursery Suite.

## LENTEN DEVOTIONAL BOOKS

This year's Lenten emphasis will consider some of Jesus's most poignant questions. To guide our reflections we'll be using Matthew Croasmun's book *Let Me Ask You A Question: Conversations with Jesus*.
